Social Justice Cell inauguration and seminar (April 24, 2023)

A seminar was conducted as part of the event at the college seminar hall on 24 April 2023, at 10 am. The Social Justice cell was inaugurated by the Honorable Agricultural Minister, P. Prasad. The seminar was held on the topic "Constitution and social justice", by Safi Mohan, Assistant Professor of Law College, Trivandrum. The class was engaging and addressed topics like the Indian constitution. Prof. Mohan expressed his concern about how we aren't aware of our own rights and duties. Around 100 Volunteers took part in this Seminar. The class was informative and interactive.

camp was conducted under the supervision of Dr. Jyothi, Ahalya Eye Hospital Changanassery. The camp was a huge success.






Old age home cleaning (5 May 2023)


World Day against Child Labor (12 June 2023)








Fathers Day (18 June 2023)




National Reading Day (19 June 2023)




International Day Against Drug Abuse & Illicit Trafficking (26 June 2023)






Awareness on Indian Constitution (04 July 2023)




World Population day(11 July 2023)










IGNITE - APJ Abdul Kalam quiz (October 16, 2023)



Harmony day (31


October, 2023)


Legal Service Day (November 09, 2023)


World Diabetes Day (14/11/2023)






International Childrens day(November 20,2024)

World Hindi Day (January 10, 2024)








Vembanad water bird count 2024 (January 21,2024)










VitaRinnova - Blood Donation Camp (January 30, 2024)








World Wetlands Day (February 02, 2024)
